Minister's Letter

Dear Friends,

What is green and hairy and goes up and down?

'A gooseberry in a lift' I sense you replying to an old joke.

May is an up and down season in the cycle of church life. During this month we remember the Ascension of Jesus on Thursday 9th May. Then ten days later we celebrate Pentecost, the coming down of the gift of the Holy Spirit marking the birth of the Church, which we celebrate this year on Sunday 19th May.

The disciples knew all about up and down experiences. They travelled with Jesus around Galilee, hearing and reflecting on his teaching, wondering at the healings, valuing his friendship and perhaps from time to time taking a little pride in their role as close associates of someone well known in the area. Then a shadow appeared, first cast by Jesus speaking unthinkably about going to Jerusalem and facing death. The shadow deepened as they approached Jerusalem until the fateful day when the shadow cast was of the cross-bound Jesus. The disciples knew all about the up experiences of life and the deepest of downs'

But that wasn't the end' We learn how the risen Jesus appeared to the disciples over a few precious weeks before finally ascending to God, and of the coming of the Holy Spirit.

It is interesting to reflect on the impact that Christ's ascension had. It may have been natural for the disciples, having lost their teacher and friend to shrink back into themselves, rudderless without Jesus. If that had happened we may never have heard of Jesus, and there might not be a movement called the Church. But the opposite happened. With the words of Christ's commissioning ringing in their ears, and feeling empowered through the mystery of God's Holy Spirit, the disciples stayed staring up to the empty sky in loss, but moved on, looking outwards with Christ's calling and commissioning in their heart.

The final gifts of Jesus were to leave, creating space for the disciples to continue his ministry, and sending the Holy Spirit anew, to empower them in their ministry. And the consequence was a multiplication, not of loaves and fish, but where there was once Jesus and 12 disciples, there developed a larger group of apostles and even more converts. The multiplication continues to this day through successive generations. God through Christ continues to call the church to look out, still encouraging and equipping it through the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Two thousand years on from the Ascension, and we, too, live in decidedly up and down times. Just now the world feels in a particularly parlous state, with the ongoing and devastating war in Ukraine, likewise the civil war in Sudan rendering much of the population facing famine, and top of the news and the global worry list is the conflict between Hamas and Israel, leaving countless civilian casualties and an escalation of hostilities in the wider region. We can feel powerless.

But we are not powerless. We can act including praying and lobbying for peace (see next page). And we can give, with a natural focus this month on Christian Aid week, which this year falls between Christ's Ascension and Pentecost. One of their current actions is their Middle East Crisis Appeal.

In the ups and downs of this season, as individuals and as a church we can be part of the 'up' movement, making a difference in Christ's name in our tatty world.

And through all struggles, may we hold onto the last words of Christ as given by the evangelist Matthew.

'And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age'.

As the sun rises in May's sky, may rays of God's love warm our lives.



PS, I promised to let you know about a reply from our MP, Bob Stewart, to the letter that I sent offering perspectives for peace and community harmony from Bromley's Three Faiths Forum (Jewish, Christian and Muslim). Sad to say that despite me sending him a reminder, he hasn't replied. Please assume that unless I advise otherwise, he's chosen not to reply. I suggest that if anyone wishes to lobby a serving politician advocating peace, they write to someone else, perhaps the PM or Foreign Secretary?



Nature ramblings - if you go down to the woods today...



Having 'time out' does us all good from time to time, certainly me, perhaps you and Jesus too. Jesus did so in preparing for his ministry with time in the wilderness, through his ministry going to quiet places to pray, and in the anxiety and trauma of facing the cross he went to Gethsemane to pray' Having 'time out' does us all good from time to time, me, you and Jesus too.

Yesterday, wrestling with a sermon and having

stared at the screen for too long, I chose to head out between showers for a wander in the woods at Hutchinson's Bank For me, a stroll through a Spring woodland with

birds singing and flowers blooming is one of the best ways I know to clear the mind and find new inspiration.

I was blessed by swathes of bluebells coming into bloom, scattered violets, some late blooming wood anemones, the lesser celandine, and toothwort (which I wrote about last Spring). I also spotted what I hoped to see, Moschatel (pictured right), an oft missed low-lying diminutive wonder.

The flower's name derives from Latin for 'musk', for it diffuses a fragrance in the evening akin to deer musk. This little bloom has gained other tags too, including Muskroot, Hollowroot, Tuberous Crowfoot and my favourite, the Town-Hall Clock. The latter name reflects the flower's characteristic four outward facing blooms, like a town-hall clock, and a fifth face which can be seen from above.

I won't pretend that my walk in the wood straightened everything out in my mind, not least the sermon that I was wrestling with, but it did me good seeing and bathing in part of creation's wonder (and provided copy for this month's edition of Nature ramblings!)

As I wandered home it struck me that were Jesus to have preached the Sermon on the Mount in our time and place, rather than encouraging people to set aside their worries by considering the lilies of the valley, he may have invited them to consider the blooms of the English Spring wood.

So, if you go down to the woods today... may you be blessed by peace and wonder.

PS My March column told of my first butterfly spot of the year being a Peacock. I promised an update, so report that my 2024 species list is now seven, with the addition of Holly Blue, Brimstone, Red Admiral, Comma, Small White and Speckled Wood. And at least one church member is ahead of me having seen my favourite, an orange tip!

Carol was born and bred in Balham and was educated at Grey Coats Hospital School in Westminster, where she developed her love of sport. She was a keen Brownie and Girl Guide and was active with her church youth club. After she left school Carol worked as a secretary.

Carol and John married in 1963 and moved to Wood Lodge Lane in West Wickham in 1964. At that time they joined Emmanuel and became active in church life. Carol ran the Brownies for 17 years and there are numerous girls, now grown up with their own families, who have fond memories of Tara (Brown Owl) She joined the badminton club and Emmanuel Keys, she sang in the choir and up until her death, was a loyal

member of Women's Fellowship (now known as Fellowship) Carol was an Elder for a time and until quite recently a Pastoral Assistant. She also loved playing the hand bells with the Wandle Ringers.

For about 35 years Carol enjoyed a weekly exercise class with Anthea Tong, myself and 3 other ladies and throughout those years, as well as keeping fit, we offered friendship and support to each other. Carol continued to attend a keep fit class at Bencurtis Park until just a few months ago.

Carol and John loved overseas travel and over a period of about 20 years had some amazing trips to over 20 countries, but also found time for family holidays in Cornwall.

Family was everything to Carol, she was a loving and caring Mum and Grandma and she was always interested and supportive in whatever activity her 3 children Diane, John-Paul and Helen and her 4 grandchildren Emma, Matthew, Anny and Scott were involved in.

After John died Carol moved into a bungalow in Bencurtis Park and enjoyed chatting with friends and neighbours during her daily walk around the grounds. She was a social person and well known for her love of visits to Costa coffee with friends and family.

But I will also remember Carol as quite a private person, she was thoughtful and always measured when she spoke. The death of Helen, Carol's youngest daughter just a few months ago, was a devastating blow, but she bore this loss with great fortitude.

Carol was a loyal friend and will be missed by many.
